

Licensed Mental Health Clinician (LCSW, LMFT, LPCC)

Position Summary

The Pathway Home, Inc. (TPH) is seeking a dynamic, mission driven Licensed Mental Health Clinician (MHC) to join our clinical treatment team providing educational, professional, and clinical support in a residential setting to post-9/11 Veterans pursuing academic or vocational endeavors who are transitioning back to the civilian world following military deployments.

This position will be responsible for providing and documenting mental health and case management services to Veterans at TPH. The MHC will be instrumental in shaping clinical programming, creating and facilitating group therapy, workshops, and seminars to provide psychoeducation, address mental health issues, and bolster the coping strategies relevant to the student Veterans served by TPH. This position will monitor a case load of residents throughout their time in the program and will be instrumental in preparing their transition plan. Additionally, this position will be responsible for engaging in community outreach, developing community resources, and planning therapeutic wellness/recreation activities. There may be opportunities for individual therapy; however, the primary role is providing group therapy and case management.

Program Overview

Established in 2008, The Pathway Home (TPH) is a non-profit agency that has served as a residential community committed to Veterans having difficulty transitioning from military service to civilian life. In its new design, the mission of TPH is to provide educational, professional, and clinical support to post-9/11 Veterans designed to enhance their lives following military service. By offering an integrated wellness program that builds on individual and collective strengths, develops critical tools that promote physical and mental health, and supports academic development and career aspirations, we aim to expand veterans' opportunities for long-term success and improved quality of life.

Qualifications

- M.A./M.S. in counseling, social work, marriage and family therapy, or related field.
- An active CA clinical license to practice independently.
- Minimum of 1 year providing direct services to clients in a mental health setting.
- Minimum 2 years of residential program experience preferred.
- Certification in or experience with evidence based (traditional and/or alternative complementary) therapies for PTSD, emotion regulation, insomnia, nightmares, and other mental health issues.
- Experience working with Veterans, preferably post-9/11, in a mental health setting and familiarity with post-deployment issues strongly preferred.
- Some knowledge of CA state Community Care Licensing and Dept. of Mental Health Services regulations governing Social Rehabilitation Facilities helpful.

Primary Duties and Responsibilities

Demonstrated ability to:

- Collaborate on clinical program development to enhance offering of evidence based treatment and shape clinical programming at TPH.
- Develop and lead clinical groups, workshops, and seminars relevant to resident's need.
- Provide weekly case management, assess needs, and connect clients with resources.
- Coordinate discharge planning, make referrals, work effectively with clients who required intensive case management.
- Formulate clinical assessments, write treatment plans, and provide crisis intervention.
- Participate in milieu and regular clinical team consultation sessions with clients.
- Maintain thorough and accurate records in electronic record system.
- Attend and actively participate in weekly treatment team meetings.
- Attend and actively participate in weekly TPH Admissions meetings.
- Screen and interview veterans for TPH Admission.
- Work effectively as part of an interdisciplinary treatment team.
- Develop and cultivate relationships with community partners. Manage community resource relationships and share information with TPH treatment team.
- Respond to emergencies in compliance with TPH program emergency procedures.
- Any additional duties assigned as needed related to patient care and facility management.

Proven Skills and Abilities

- Self-starter with ability to thrive in a start-up environment.
- Supportive and energetic team player.
- Ability to work a flexible schedule, including evenings and some weekends.
- Excellent verbal and written communication skills.
- Effective conflict resolution skills.
- Able to respond to crisis in a manner consistent with policies and procedures
- Ability to cooperate and contribute as part of a multi-disciplinary team
